Engage

Develop

Collaborating Colin will help us to learn how to work as a team together to help each other and to learn from each other as we plan a party.

Noticing

We will be stretching our noticing muscle to spot similarities and differences between different faiths and festivals, and how people chose to celebrate.

Planning

We will learn that planning is important to learning, and that we can revise and adapt if we need to.

Friendship - we will be thinking about what Friendship means and how we can show this Value to others. We will be looking at stories from the bible to help us understand more about what it means and how we can develop this value within ourselves.

Spirituality: we will be thinking about being aware of ourselves and the experiences we have, and how to appreciate what we have and be generous.
