Areas of Learning

<u>As Historians</u> we will be looking at the language of time. We will also be learning about ourselves and our own history and then asking questions about our parent's and grandparent's lives.

<u>As information technologists</u> we will learn how use pictograms to display information and how to use them to show which building are in Hyde.

As Musicians we will be

listening to different types of music and using adjectives to describe it and then to try to recreate our own.

<u>In Religious Education</u> we will be learning about what Baptism means in the Christian faith and learning how Jesus was the best present given to us on earth.
