24/7 Community Pantry Project

The community pantry at 137 Stamford Street, Stalybridge, SK15 1LU has re-opened.

The pantry is a free-to-user community resource which will be part-funded over the coming 10 weeks by Tameside Council from their Winter Pressures Fund.

This will be the only 24/7 foodbank/pantry open in Greater Manchester!

The pantry will be taking donations from the community to help them stock the shelves. These include jars, tins, toiletries, period products and warm items such as scarves, gloves, hats etc.

They ask that any item not in plastic packaging be placed in a sealed see-through plastic bag as the pantry is exposed to the elements and they want to reduce goods getting damaged.

Please spread the word regarding the opening of the pantry.

Polite reminders regarding uniform Policy:

Children from Reception upwards are expected to wear smart, black school shoes as part of their school uniform. Trainers are not allowed at St George's as everyday footwear, although KS2 children may wear trainers for outside play and PE lessons.

Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns cut or shaved into their hair.

In the best interests of children's safety, jewellery is not permitted in school, including earrings. These rules are based on sound health and safety considerations.

If children are to have their ears pierced, we suggest that this is done at the beginning of the summer holiday to allow the healing process after which, earrings can be removed during school time. If children have their ears pierced at other times, they will be asked to wear plasters over the earnings until they can be taken out.
