Areas of Learning

As Mathematicians we will be looking at using common factors to simplify fractions and common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination. We will compare and order fractions including fractions greater than 1. We will add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers as well as multiplying simple pairs of proper fractions. We will divide proper fractions by whole numbers. As Geographers we will describe climatic similarities and differences between two regions. We will understand the terms latitude, longitude, Equator, Prime Meridian, Arctic Circle, Antarctic Circle, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn. We will be able to ask and answer geographical guestions using a range of fieldwork and research techniques. We will understand polar day and night. We will be able to compare and describe physical features of polar landscapes. We will explain how climate change affects climate zones and biomes across the world. We will describe the distribution of natural resources in an area or country. In R.E we will know that different denominations within Christianity hold differing beliefs about the importance and status of Mary. We will express our opinion about what we think John the Baptist's message would be today. We will talk about what our hopes and dreams are for the future. In art we will gather, record and develop information to create a mood board to inform thinking about a piece of art. We will use colour palettes and characteristics of an artist.

Areas of Learning

<u>As information technologists</u> we will independently problem solve and model situations and processes, by understanding and explaining the impact of changing variables and rules within a model.

<u>As Musicians</u> we will describe how music can be used to convey an emotion and compose a piece of music based on a theme.

<u>As writers</u> we will be studying different books and writing a range of genres from these. We will study author's skills and techniques and use this information to improve our own writing. We will improve our checking strategies.

<u>As scientists</u> we will recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to the parents. We will identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaption may lead to evolution.

<u>As readers</u> we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or text books and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices.

Building Learning Powers

We are already using lots of learning powers to help us become good learners. We will be looking at planning to help us achieve the best outcome possible and the importance of revising our ideas not just towards the end of a task but throughout the whole process. We will also focus on meta-learning to enable us to understand ourselves as learners better and therefore help us to decide upon the best learning approach to take for a given situation.
