Areas of Learning

<u>As mathematicians</u> we will measure in metres and centimetres. We will measure in centimetres and millimetres. We will find equivalent lengths. We will compare lengths. We will add lengths.

<u>As writers</u> we will be studying different books and writing our own narrative from these as well as other genres. We will study author's skills and techniques and use this information to improve our own writing. We will focus on using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to show time, place and cause.

As readers we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or textbooks and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices. As scientists we will research the names of bones in the human skeleton. We will also explore how we move our bodies. We will model an archaeological dog. We will sort bones. We will classify and compare animal skeletons. We will observe the impact of exercise.

<u>As musicians</u> we will listen to music and recognise patterns in the sounds we hear. We will learn how to play different songs on the glockenspiel.
