Learning Challenges Engage

Develop

To continue with our learning journey, we will use the texts The Busy Little Squirrel and Squirrel's Busy Day to explore woodland animals, their habitats and their habits during Autumn and Winter. We will be thinking about how things change and why, and what animals do to help themselves during these changes. We will also be continuing our journey into learning to read and write

To share with you everything that we have learnt during this learning challenge, we are going to write a recipe for muffins that you could make at home to feed the animals or birds that visit your gardens and back yards.
