Areas of Learning

<u>As readers</u> we will retrieve and record information from non-fiction sources as well as exploring a range of reference books to discover what the Romans achieved

<u>As geographers</u> we will draw sketch maps and plans using agreed symbols for a key. Use the 8-point compass to describe location, showing what countries Romans controlled through their competitive advances.

As scientists we will predict, explore and compare the affect of forces and magnets. We will investigate the properties of magnets and metals in order to group and classify objects.

As caring citizens we will recognise our worth as individuals by identifying positive things about ourselves and setting personal goals. We will be courageous advocates through our charitable support.

As information technologists we will use branching databases to make links with the Roman achievements through history.

<u>As musicians</u> we will compare music from different time periods.

What did the Romans achieve?

Christian Values

Our value this half term is justice and we will discover the different ways that we can experience justice. We will explore the main types of justice: personal, social and global – making links to Rights Respecting and our ethos.

We will explore the peace that Jesus brought to Earth and how other people's view can work towards or against peace.

Children will learn about justice linked to:

Solving disputes and personal rivalries, experience the rules of school, the golden rule and understand fairness (linked to out previous learning challenge. They will also link this to Fairtrade and UNICEF Rights Respecting 'Shoe Share' as our act of courageous advocacy.

We will show mutual respect by becoming familiar with giving peer feedback to our friends, ensuring it is 'kind, specific and helpful.' We will show respect for the ways that people in our community live their lives and offer help and support that is kind and helpful. We will consider the values the Romans had and understand how this can be compared/contrasted to our lives today.

Successful Learners

Areas of Learning

<u>As historians</u> we will learn about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. Describing some of the main changes in Britain linked to competitive activities and actions of people from that time period.

<u>As writers</u> we will increase the legibility, consistency and quality of our handwriting and also propose changes to grammar and vocabulary to improve consistency in our writing, sharing facts about Roman achievements.

As artists and design technologists we will Explain the purpose of a given task and identify the materials and tools for the job. Create plans for a task. Copy and create patterns and develop the techniques used by the Romans.

As mathematicians we will read Roman numerals to 100 (I to C) and will be learning to use multiplication and division facts to solve problems with 3s, 4s and 8s.

Building Learning Powers

Following on from last term we will be using our **noticing** skills and **making links** between our current knowledge and how we can use this to deepen our learning. We will work on our **distilling** skills by looking at different pieces of evidence and pulling out the essential information we will need, using this information to understand and explain in our own words. As **meta-learners**, we will be also talking about what skills we have and what we need in order to complete our tasks, becoming more aware of our own strengths and weaknesses to improve our learning.

This half term we will be learning about Romans and deepening our investigative skills to explore our understanding. A reminder that the school day has changed slightly: We begin our learning at 8:40am and finish at 3pm. Please make sure you arrive promptly so your child understands their morning work and is ready for their day of learning.
