Learning Challenges

Engage

When we go to Forest School we will look for signs of spring. We will explore the environment and ask questions. We will listen for the sounds of birds singing. We will look for signs of growth and change since we last visited.

Develop

To continue with our learning journey we will read Errol's Garden. We will think about and plan together what plants we would like to grow. We will grow and look after plants and seeds. The children will observe how the plants grow and change over time. The children will look after the plants by watering them.

We will read spring-themed nursery rhymes and poems that contain rhyming or repetitive phrases. Children will play along with one-handed percussion instruments.

We will use our noticing skills to explore the appearance, scent and feel of a variety of herbs, plants and cut flowers.
