Areas of Learning

<u>As Historians</u> we will be looking at the language of time. We will be learning all about the Great Fire of London and finding out about the different sources that we can use to find more information about it.

<u>As scientists</u> we will be looking at animals and learning how to groups them depending on what they look like and what they eat.

<u>As Mathematicians</u> we will be concentrating finding equal groups of amounts and objects, finding halves and doubles of numbers and counting and knowing numbers to 100.

<u>As Musicians</u> we will be describing the sounds from a fire. We will also be singing songs linked to The Great Fire of London and songs linked to our science learning.
