<p><u>As mathematicians</u> we will add and subtract fractions. We will partition the whole. We will find unit fractions and non-unit fractions of a set of objects. We will learn the roman numerals to 12. We will tell the time to 5 minutes. We will tell the time to the minute.</p> <p><u>As information technologists</u> we will understand what a flowchart is and how they are used in computer programming. We will understand that there are different types of timers and will be able to use the right type of timer for a purpose. We will understand how to use the repeat command.</p> <p><u>As historians</u> we will use evidence to ask questions and find answers to questions about the past. We will suggest causes and consequences of some of the main events and changes in history. We will describe the social, ethnic, cultural or religious diversity of past society and we will use appropriate historical vocabulary to communicate including dates, time period, era, change and chronology.</p> <p><u>In R.E</u> we will know that Christians believe that Jesus has/had the power to change people's lives. We will know that choosing to follow Jesus is not an easy option and that lives of people today are transformed by Jesus and they choose to change. We will retell the Bible stories we have explored and talk about the ways in which Jesus changed people's lives and the impact that had on them.</p>			<p><u>As writers</u> we will be studying different books and writing our own narrative from these as well as other genres. We will study author's skills and techniques and use this information to improve our own writing. We will focus on using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to show time, place and cause.</p> <p><u>As readers</u> we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or textbooks and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices.</p> <p><u>As scientists</u> we will identify pushes and pulls, compare how things move on different surfaces, explore magnets and learn what makes things move. We will also classify coins and test the strength of magnets.</p> <p><u>As artists</u> we will research a selection of Victoria Topping's illustrations and create an annotated image board. We will explore using a variety of art materials to create patterns and shaped. We will know what collage means. We will demonstrate how to create a collages using photographs and a variety of art materials.</p>
<div>Christian Values</div> <p>This term in school we are exploring the value of Justice.</p> <p>Justice - We will consider all the wonderful things we have to be thankful for and who we can show our thankfulness to.
