Successful Learners Areas of Learning

<u>As historians</u> we will be studying life during the Roman times and how we know about the past based clues left behind. We will learn about Vesuvius and what happened in Pompeii.

As scientists we will recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of different ways. We will explore and use classification keys to identify and name living things in their local and wider environment. We will also recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes be a problem.

<u>As mathematicians</u> we will deepen our understanding of place value with numbers up to thousands. We will solve problems linked to addition and subtraction using written and mental calculations. We will also learn our times tables

<u>In PSHE</u> we will look at our feelings and the impact on others, making links with the zones of regulation. We will try to understand why we might be feeling this way and think about how we can get out of different zones.

As readers and writers, we will continue to develop our comprehension and vocabulary in all areas of reading and writing in a range of genres both fiction and non-fiction. We will study the novel 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy and Jane Ray.

<u>As information technologists</u> we will learn how to Code by programming instructions for a computer using Purple Mash. We will use the computer/iPad to research and present our learning.

In <u>Religious Education</u> we will be exploring if all churches are the same. We will visit St George's and look at the features of the church. We will be learning about Harvest and how our school's values link with it.

In PE (Physical Education) we will practise our ball skills when learning how to play hockey. We will dribble and pass the ball, working as a team to defend and attack.

<u>In music</u> we will be working with Mr Hallighan to shape composition, considering dynamics, timbre and tempo.
