They had a lovely morning with her and asked her lots of questions to gain more understanding of life during this time.

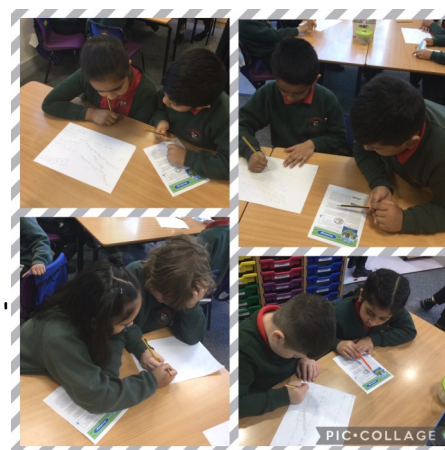


Year 3
