


<div>Learning Challenges</div> <div>Engage</div> <div>We will go to the Forest School area to look for signs of spring. We will explore the environment and ask questions. We will collect objects such as feathers, seeds and buds. We will listen for the sounds of birds singing.</div> <div>Develop</div> <div>To continue with our learning journey we will read Jasper's Beanstalk and Jack and the Beanstalk to find out how you help plants grow. We will grow and look after beans, cress and other plants and seeds. The children will observe how the plants grow and change over time. The children will look after the plants by watering them.</div> <div>We will read spring-themed nursery rhymes and poems that contain rhyming or repetitive phrases. Children will play along with one-handed percussion instruments.</div> <div>We will use our noticing skills to explore the appearance, scent and feel of cut spring flowers.</div>	<div>Nursery</div> <div>How does your garden grow?</div> <div></div>	<div>Learning Challenges</div> <div>Innovate</div> <div>The children will decide who they are going to give the plants they have grown from seed to. They will decorate and personalise a gift tag for their plant. We will plan for a garden party together. The children will decide on games, make decorations and food.</div> <div>Express</div> <div>To share with you everything that we have learnt during this learning challenge we will have a garden party. We will play games and have some party food. Children will present their parents with plants they have grown.</div>

<div>Noticing</div> <div>Noticing Nora will be helping us to use our senses to explore the world around us, and describe what we can see, smell, touch, feel and taste.</div>	<div>Questioning</div> <div>Questioning Queen will help us to ask and answer question, such as "What has happened?" "Why...?" "How can we..?" "Where...?"</div>

<div>Generosity - using the examples of Jesus Christ to find out what the value of generosity means and how we can show this at school and at home.
