Areas of Learning


As mathematicians we will learn about shapes and angles. After we have learnt about shapes and angles, we will move onto learning about position and direction before finally looking at adding and subtracting decimals. Alongside this, we will continue our work on increasing our fluency and speed at recalling times tables. We will also be doing a weekly arithmetic sessions where we will be looking at the four different mathematical operations.

As scientists we will continue our work on the properties of materials and we will be looking at a range of reversible and irreversible reactions. To do this we will be completing a range of different tests and we will be discussing how to make these tests fair and practice our working scientifically skills.

As artists we will use a sketch book and combine a range of media within a piece of work and explain the desired effect. We will compare and comment on ideas/methods/approaches in our own and others' work. We will explain how a piece of artwork makes us feel.

In Religious Education we will know that the Book of Acts records the actions of what happened after the Pentecost. We will know that the early Christians were persecuted for over 300 years and had to show great courage and perseverance. We will know that St Paul is a significant person in the history of Christianity and why. We will be able to talk about what we have learnt and in what ways we have been inspired by our learning.

The value we will be exploring this half term is **Generosity.**

We will study the bible to find out about the importance of generosity and then we will think how we can be more generous with our time, money and talents.

Spirituality

We will learn about having a sense of choice, decision making and personal responsibility – standing up for the things that we believe and developing our courageous advocacy for what we feel is right.

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As writers we will be looking more closely at poems. We will be exploring the life of Benjamin Zephaniah. We will look at how poetry can be used to represent different people of the world and different situations in the world. We will also look at how he presents his poems on the page and how it effects the way the poems are read.

As readers we will read a range of knowledge bursts about the Industrial Revolution and the impact this time had on Tameside today. We will also learn new vocabulary relating to this. We will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or text books. We will read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices.

As historians we will use sources of evidence from the Victorian era to deduce information about the past and conclude how it impacts our lives today. We will explore the evolution of technology during this time and research the various jobs that factories would have offered workers in the local area. We will describe the main changes in a period of history and conclude how the Industrial Revolution has affected. We will learn how to debate respectfully with our peers to express our own findings that link to the Learning Challenge question.

<u>Building Learning Powers</u> Reciprocity, Resourcefulness, Reflectiveness and Resilience

This half term we will be stretching lots of our building learning power muscles. In particular, we will be stretching our linking muscle to conclude which aspects of Tameside have been impacted by the Industrial Revolution. We will also be using our collaborative muscle to remind ourselves how we can achieve the best outcomes with the support of our peers. As a Historian, we will be using our noticing muscle when inspecting artefacts and making predictions about these. We will learn to persevere when gathering knowledge from a range of Historical sources and use our distilling muscle to choose the most relevant pieces of information. We will be resourceful when thinking about which aspects of the Industrial Revolution have affected Tameside.
