<div>Successful Learners</div> <div>Areas of Learning</div> <div><p>As Mathematicians we will continue to look at adding and subtracting decimals. Alongside this, we will continue our work on increasing our fluency and speed at recalling times tables. We will also be doing a weekly arithmetic sessions where we will be looking at the four different mathematical operations. we will learn about negative numbers and understand the difference between positive and negative whole numbers. In our measurement unit, we will look at converting between different units of measure. We will also look at capacity and volume. We will continue to work on our arithmetic skills for all four options. Finally, we will look at staticitics and at different types of graphs and tables.</p><p>As Geographers we will use the 4 figure grid references in order to communicate knowledge of the United Kingdom. We will identify and describe how the physical features affect the human activity within a location. We will collect and analyse statistics in order to draw conclusions about a location. We will look at other Non-Fiction texts to aid in our understanding of the layout of Non-Fiction texts.</p><p>As Readers we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or text books and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices</p><p>As scientists we will continue our work on properties of materials. We will continue to look at the way different materials interact with each other. We will look at different types of reactions and categories different events into those types of reactions.</p><p>In computing we will be continuing our work on coding and making our own 3D models. We will be looking at online safety and how we stay safe online and how we can trust different information from the internet.</p><p>In PE we will be continuing on our weekly swimming lessons and we will be continuing our development on our invasion games skills and increasing our understanding around tactics for attacking and defending.</p></div>
