Areas of Learning

As mathematicians we will use scales, measure mass in kilograms and grams and compare mass. We will use pounds and pence, convert pounds and pence, add money. subtract money and find change. As information technologists we will sort objects using just YES/NO questions. We will complete a branching database using 2Question. We will create a branching database of the children's choice. As geographers we will explain own views about locations, giving reasons. We will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features. We will use fieldwork to observe and record the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods including sketch maps, plans and graphs and digital technologies.

In R.E we will know key stories in the life of David, we will know that David is a key figure in the Old Testament, and we will know that Christians believe that the nature of God is revealed in the Psalms. We will identify values that I think are important, we will connect values and Christian beliefs to events and teaching in the bible. We will ask important questions about the stories of David.

As readers we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or textbooks and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices.

<u>As scientists</u> we will explore rocks in the local environment, we will explore gravestones and how they differ and we will explore the nature and characteristics of different rocks. We will explore soil.
