Successful Learners Areas of Learning

As historians we will be studying the Anglo-Saxons and researching what life was like for the people who settled in Britain. We will make links with our communication and writing, focusing on historical research to present our learning.


As scientists we will use scientific vocabulary as we explore solids, liquids and gases through investigations, looking at how solids and liquids can be separated. We will also investigate the water cycle.

<u>As mathematicians</u> we will practise our times tables (including the inverse facts) and try and improve our speed of recall. We will be developing our understanding of written calculations to solve number problems including fractions.

<u>In PSHE</u> we will be looking at friendship and that their actions affect themselves and others. We will look at why trust is an important value in friendship and complement our friends who are trustworthy.

<u>In D&T</u> we will be using the TASC wheel to help us research, plan, make and evaluate a paper boat which can hold a weight.

Successful Learners Areas of Learning

As readers and writers, we will continue to develop our comprehension and vocabulary in all areas of reading and writing in a range of genres both fiction and non-fiction. We will study the novel 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' by Joe Stanton which links nicely with our learning challenge. We will also be reading and writing about the Anglo-Saxons.

As information technologists we will learn to use the chrome books to create spreadsheets understanding and inputting data. We will also deepen our knowledge of vocabulary.

In <u>Religious Education</u> we will be deepen our understanding of Jesus, who he was, his teaching and behaviour. We will do this by listening and reading his stories, especially the miracles he performed.

<u>In PE (Physical Education)</u> we will learn how to play invasion games and develop skills of throwing and catching.

In music we will be working with Mr Hallighan to shape composition, considering dynamics, timbre and tempo using our learning challenge as inspiration.
