We will begin to use symbols to represent the sounds we make and describe them using musical vocabulary.</p>

<p><b>Distilling</b></p> <p>We will work on our <b>distilling</b> skills by looking at different pieces of evidence and pulling out the essential information we will need. We will be using our <b>noticing</b> skills and <b>making links</b> between our geographical surroundings and the transport links and how this has affected Tameside over the years.</p>	<p>We will be concentrating on our questioning skills and then distilling the information found to help us answer these questions by choosing the most appropriate sources.</p>	<p><b>Meta-Learning</b></p> <p>We will be talking about what skills we already have and what skills we need in order to complete our tasks, becoming more aware of our own strengths and weaknesses to improve our learning.</p>
