Successful Learners

Areas of Learning

<u>As scientists</u> we will be exploring living things and their habitats. In particular we will be learning about vertebrates and invertebrates.

As mathematicians

We will be consolidating our place value learning from last year and will begin to work with numbers up to 10 million. We will apply our new knowledge to reasoning and problem solving activities

As Musicians...

We will be composing our own music based on Vikings raiding and sailing. We will learn about the different sounds that certain instruments make and decide which would be best to compose our pieces with. We will also learn if music mattered to the Vikings - did they listen to it? Did they play musical instruments and if so which?

<u>In PSHE</u> we will be recognising what it means to be a part of a family. We will be comparing our families and the values that we have instilled from a young age. We will reflect on how families were similar or different during the Viking times and if they held the same family values that we do today. We will explore if they travelled with their families and the different roles that men and women may have had during this time period.

As readers and writers,

We will be learning about some of the technical grammatical features within Year 6 and applying these when writing during other curriculum areas. We will be writing non - chronological reports to explain what mattered

As Historians...

In Physical Education

We will complete the daily mile and increase our stamina. We will also take part in a range of different invasion games as well as discussing what fair play means and why it is important to keep to the rules of play.
