Areas of Learning

As Mathematicians we will add two numbers (no exchange), subtract numbers (no exchange), add 2-digit and 3-digit numbers, subtract a 2-digit number from a 3-digit number, learn complements to 100 and inverse operations.

<u>As information technologists</u> we will understand how the internet can be used to help us to communicate effectively. We will consider if what can be read on websites is always true. We will learn about the meaning of age restrictions symbols on digital media and devices.

As Geographers we will ask and answer questions about the physical and human characteristics of a location. We will use fieldwork to observe and record the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods including sketch maps, plans and graphs and digital technologies. We will describe key aspects of physical geography, including rivers, mountains, volcanoes, earthquakes and the water cycle. In R.E we will learn about rules followed by people of other faiths. We will talk, with understanding, about rules from faiths other than Christianity. We will understand the effects of rules and ask good questions about religious rule. We will know that other faiths have rules to follow that have been given to them a long time ago.

As writers we will be studying different books and writing our own narrative from these as well as other genres. We will study author's skills and techniques and use this information to improve our own writing. We will focus on authorial intent and vocabulary choices.

As Readers we will continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or textbooks and read books that are structured in different ways and read for a range of purposes. We will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices. As scientists we will view different objects in a box, we will experience true darkness, we will investigate the reflective nature of different materials, we will identify materials that are opaque. transparent and translucent, we will explore suitable materials for sunglasses, we will explore shadows in the playground. As musicians we will listen to and create our own music. We will appreciate and understand high quality music.

We will be focusing on being resourceful learners by asking questions, carrying out investigations and making connections with what we already know. We will relate these skills to all the learning we are doing and learn the importance of being able to assess our own progress in these Building Learning Powers.
